AAUW Executive Council Meeting April 13, 2017 1:30 p.m. at the home of Priscilla Kerr

Those in attendance were the following: Joann Nixon, Executive Council Leader; Sandy Davini, Treasurer; Janet Theiss, Communications Leader; Karen Tuttle, Bylaws Leader; Jeanine Rounds, Secretary Members at Large: Artis Buerki, Colleen Franklin, Priscilla Kerr, and Joan Young **Call to Order, 1: 35**

Minutes, Reports:

Minutes of March 9, 2017, were approved as submitted.

<u>Counsel Leader Report:</u> Joann requested information about whose terms will expire after the 2017-18 meeting, and it was agreed it will be for Karen Tuttle (Bylaws) and Lee Jones (Membership), plus Sandy Davini (Treasurer).

For the coming year, Jeanine Rounds, Janet Theiss, and Sandy Davini had been elected at the Branch meeting on April 10.

<u>Correspondence:</u> Sandy passed out some brief correspondence. Joann indicated she had been contacted by the Core Charter School in Marysville, which is planning on offering a week's workshop this summer, in conjunction with UC-Davis, on robotics and coding. The course will be free to about 20 girls from grades 6-8, but the Charter school is requesting AAUW donate \$1000 for two student mentors. It was agreed we should notify the parents of the girls who had applied but not been accepted the AAUW Tech Trek program about the opportunity. Jeanine moved and Sandy seconded that Joann contact Marilyn Warmee with the information; and if it is agreed we should participate, we will fund \$500. Motion passed.

Artis Buerki reported that she and Joann had been contacted by Rachel Rosebaum of the <u>Appeal Democrat</u> regarding an article the paper is doing about AAUW. She is not sure when it will be published (*note: the article was published* on 4/15).

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Sandy said balance is good, and that we have received \$1,354 from sponsors for the Garden Tour and about \$1,000 from membership sales of tickets. She also said that, with the help of Priscilla, our branch has raised \$708 for our "opportunity drawings."

Public Policy: Martha not present.

<u>Membership</u>: Lee was not present, but Sandy said our paid membership is now 96.

<u>Historian/Bylaws Update:</u> Karen Tuttle said she needs to take quite a few historical things to the Yuba County Library and requested someone go with her. Joann said she would do so.

Next Karen Tuttle said Janet had reviewed changes from National regarding Bylaws. Initial information had been sent to the Council, but an improved format will be emailed immediately. Members are asked to vote by phone to Karen by May 2, and we will review comments at the May 11 Executive Committee meeting. If possible we will do a membership vote at the June 3 Branch meeting.
