VISIT WITH THE CONGRESSMAN

On a recent Monday Artis Buerki, our Feather Vane editor, received a call from the office of Congressional Representative John Garamendi in Washington DC, inviting members of our AAUW group to meet with him Friday morning at his Yuba City office. Eight enthusiastic ladies from Marysville-Yuba City AAUW attended, and with a bowls of nuts, packages of Sunsweet prunes and other products from District 3, (his large Nor-Cal agricultural district, part of which we call home) Congressman Garamendi expressed his feelings on several subjects. This meeting was held 6 days following the Women's March, the turnout with which he was greatly impressed, noting its "incredible energy." He hoped this fervor expressed in much of the U.S. and the world would grow and succeed with positive action for women's rights, immigration reform, health care reform, and other human rights issues.

He compared this march to previous marches, observing that other organizers had promoted issues only to fade into the sunset due to flagging interest. He urged us to concentrate on a few specific issues, to write and call our representatives in Sacramento and Washington DC, and let our feelings on subjects important to us be known to those who represent us. He appeared very relaxed and we benefitted from our meeting with him. He was well aware of AAUW, TECH TREK and STEM. In his early years his mother hosted AAUW meetings in their home. He was tasked with serving tea to the ladies!!!

Feb 3, 2017 - This month,

Congress' phones and inboxes have been flooded by energized AAUW members and supporters nationwide. You may be among the hundreds of thousands of Americans who recently called, emailed, or even <u>faxed</u> members of Congress. AAUW's momentum is growing stronger each day, and we're seeing results.

After receiving dozens of messages from AAUW members in their states, Republican U.S. Senators Susan Collins (R-ME) and Lisa Murkowski (R-AK) **announced** they planned to vote against Betsy DeVos' confirmation as secretary of education.

Last week, AAUW members sent nearly 5,000 messages to Congress to make it known that repealing the Affordable Care Act (ACA), especially without a viable replacement, is a bad idea. Congress listened, as key lawmakers now say they aim to repair the ACA rather than repeal the entire law. To put it simply, your advocacy is working.

Over the next 100 days, you'll have the opportunity to take advantage of this momentum by taking action on 10 items important to AAUW. For over 135 years, AAUW has been the nation's leading voice promoting equity and education for women and girls – and thanks to members like you, we aren't backing down now.


