BRANCH BYLAWS UPDATE by Karen Tuttle, Bylaws Leader

The updated Bylaws were approved at our October branch meeting by a

unanimous vote of those present There are required mandatory sections and sections for our local branch that were changed to improve clarity.

AAUW California Governance Update - In 2008, during AAUW CA reorganization, an error was made affecting the standing of AAUW CA under California nonprofit law, the tax exempt status with the IRS and the affiliation with AAUW National by changing from the original "public benefit" organization to a "mutual benefit" organization. This error can potentially lead to AAWU CA losing affiliation with AAUW National and eligibility in participating in AAUW programs including Tech Trek. Every member with AAUW CA was requested to vote by October 1st to change AAUW CA back to a "public benefit" organization from a "mutual benefit" organization to align with the status of AAUW. The current status is that a unanimous approval did not occur and therefore a "fairness determination" process with the Secretary of State by AAUW CA legal counsel will begin with a considerable financial impact on AAUW CA.

Call to Order, 1:30

Minutes, Reports: <u>Minutes</u> of September 14, 2017, were approved as corrected.

<u>Council Leader Report</u>: Joann requested we identify the date of the December Coalition Brunch, which was identified as December 9. Sandy said there will be information on payment costs and dates published in next <u>Feather Vane</u>. Callers will receive separate calls for the November and December meetings. Joann also said she will be contacting the Sutter County and Yuba County superintendents of schools regarding their scholarship donations for our Tech Trek girls.

<u>Correspondence:</u> Sandy passed out correspondence, which included a number of requests for donations; anyone who was interested could take the information.

<u>Treasurer's Report and Proposed Budget</u>: Sandy gave a brief budget report, saying very little had changed since her last report. We are hoping to spend down some of our balance and finish the year with about \$11,000 reserve. The budget went to the membership and was approved at the meeting on September 16. A major reason that we are doing so well relates to the sponsorships we have obtained for the Garden Tour in the past couple of years.

It had earlier been approved that AAUW would pay for the cost of the meal at a branch meeting attended by a potential member. The group wanted to modify this, and Sandy Davini moved that the cost would be paid for the first meeting attended by a <u>new</u> member. Janet Theiss seconded, and motion was approved.

Public Policy: No report.

<u>Membership</u>: Sandy said current membership, including scholarship winners is 94. She said that Corky Ulrey had just qualified as an "Honorary" Life Member for her 50 years in AAUW, and Joann will honor her at the branch meeting on Saturday.

Other reports from Executive Council

<u>Historian/Bylaws Update:</u> Karen Tuttle said the Yuba County Library is running out of space for any more historical materials until it discards some that are not connected to Yuba County. Karen will continue to keep our materials in her containers and hope that there will be space developed.

<u>Bylaws:</u> We will need to vote on Saturday for the fairly minor revisions to our own bylaws, and Karen will present information to the members.* The change that was to have been made to the state bylaws failed because there were some who voted against. Not sure what will happen next, or whether our tax level will be affected.

Communications: Janet Theiss reported. Feather Vane: Reminded us that 10/23 deadline for information to Artis. Ethel Breyfogle, who has been handling our mailing, was asked to report. She said that the costs of mailing the roster were higher this fall, and she presented several ideas, such as purchasing envelopes that fit the current USPS criteria for a lower postage rate, and the Council approved this. Although the Council agreed that it was important to mail the leftovers after distributing the rosters at the September meeting, we could reduce the numbers to be mailed if interest groups would pass out the specific rosters to their members at their October meetings. Then Ethel told us that she will be retiring from the mailing job, and we will need to find a replacement !! Artis and Janet will work to do this, and Janet said that Ethel has done a "fabulous job." Meeting Callers: Joan Young has been doing a good job of this task.

<u>Programs:</u> Barbara Solheim was absent, but the October program speaker will be Sherri Banford, talking on "Dealing with Dementia." The November speaker will be Lisa Del Pero, a lawyer, talking on "Aging Intelligently," which has largely to do with various legal choices and related activities.
