AAUW New Chief Executive

Speaks out about Title IX September 7, 2017
WASHINGTON DC — American Association of University Women Chief Executive Officer Kimberly Churches issued the following statement responding to Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos' announcement concerning the future of Title IX enforcement.

"Secretary Betsy DeVos' decision to open up Title IX for changes represents a blatant intent to roll back protections for students. It is an action that is at direct odds with upholding the civil rights of all Americans.

Make no mistake: **Title IX remains the law of the land** and this announcement does not alter in any way schools' responsibilities. DeVos' speech noted many situations in which schools have failed to adhere to the law. The response to this challenge is to *enforce* Title IX *not* to undermine it. The Department is currently collecting comments on all of its regulations, and thousands of people have vocalized their support for Title IX, its regulations, and current guidance. Secretary DeVos can

anticipate a continued call from survivors, students, and advocates for full enforcement of Title IX.

Now is also the time for schools to step up and demonstrate that they will do the right thing for their students even in the midst of potential rollbacks from the Department of Education. Considering that **89 percent of college campuses disclosed zero reported rapes last year** — despite the fact that we know incidents are far more frequent — we should move forward and build on past progress not walk back current protections.

The American Association of University Women stands with survivors and **remains committed to protecting and defending Title IX**, and to pursuing its vigorous enforcement. We must ensure our nation's dedication to full and equal educational opportunities for all students. After all, students' access to an education is on the line. Schools, and the Department of Education, owe it to them to uphold their civil rights, a promise today's announcement fails to reaffirm." By: **Kimberly Churches**

AAUW Executive Council Planning Meeting September 14, 2017 - 1:30 a.m. at the home of Sandy Davini

Those in attendance were the following:
Joann Nixon, Executive Council Leader; Carol Clark, Program; Sandy Davini, Treasurer; Lee Jones, Membership; Barbara Solheim, Program; Janet Theiss, Communications Leader; Karen Tuttle, Bylaws Leader; Jeanine Rounds, Secretary. Members at Large: Priscilla Kerr and Joan Young.

Call to Order, 1:30 - Minutes, Reports: Minutes of June 8, 2017, were approved as corrected.

Council Leader Report: Joann addressed the issue of the 4 positions up for renewal in 2017: Treasurer (Sandy, annual), Bylaws Group Leader (Karen), Membership Group Leader (Lee), and Program Leader (Barbara). Those holding current positions have the option of continuing and indicated they will continue. Lee Jones indicated she could function as our Library Liaison.

IMPORTANT: The October Executive meeting will be the 3rd Thursday, October 19, 1:30 at Marcello’s Restaurant. The November and December meetings return to the 2nd Thursday of the month, and will also be at Marcello’s. It is hoped that some members will want to order lunch.

Correspondence: Sandy passed out correspondence collected over the summer. Of particular interest was a picture of the young ladies who attended the local CORE STEM conference this summer. Sandy also promoted the Sing for the Cure concert the end of September

Treasurer’s Report and Proposed Budget: Sandy gave a substantial report of the expenses of the past year and recommendations for the year to come. She reminded us we had approved increasing what we pay to our annual auditor from \$50 to \$100; 2) increasing the honorarium we give to our speakers from \$50 to \$100; 3) keeping the amount requested for lunches to \$18; 4) comping the lunch cost for a first time visitor who may become a member; 5) possibly increasing the number of girls we send to Tech Trek from 6 to 8; and 6) not charging for the opening meeting in September. The budget will go to the membership for approval at meeting on September 16.

Public Policy: No report.

Other reports from Executive Council

Historian/Bylaws Update: Karen Tuttle said we do not yet know the final listing of the national bylaws, but should know later in the fall. She urged members who had received the option to vote on AAUW’s tax category to be sure to vote yes. Karen also spoke on the items she is preparing to take to the Yuba County Library. It was agreed that thank you letters from the Tech Trek girls would need to be kept in our own collection for only 3 years and then shredded.

Communications: Janet Theiss reported. Feather Vane: Reminded us that 9/20 is deadline for information to Artis. Barbara was requested to provide more detailed information about the program each month to encourage members to

attend. **Roster:** These have been sent to printer and will be available at our upcoming meeting 9/16. Members are asked to take copies to members who are not present when this is convenient. **Calling:** Joan Young has begun this task and it seems to be going well.

Membership: Exact numbers are incomplete, as some may be late in sending in information, but it is approximately 95, including our scholarship girls.

Programs. The specific dates and programs are listed in the Roster, but we need to be sure to promote each event. Sandy is still collecting information on our October speaker, who will be talking on dementia.

Projects:

STEM: The committee met earlier on 9/14; some members are no longer available, and the committee will need more support. The date of January 19 has been approved by the college. Barbara Alves has agreed to take on some of Marilyn Warmee's tasks, including getting correct information on contact names at each school and helping manage the Facilitators' activity. Janet Theiss will help with some of the computer aspects. Lee Jones was also asked to help Barbara learn what is needed. Jeanine was reminded to get all of the activities done that are needed in connection with Yuba College. The STEM meetings for Oct. and Nov. will be at the Cookie Tree at 10:00 on October 19 and November 9th.

Garden Tour: All went very well. We made over \$6,600. Recruiting local sponsors has added substantially to our income. Martha Bunce was not present but had held a meeting recently and is starting to work on obtaining gardens.

Tech Trek: Carol Clark said she, Donna Long, and Joann Nixon will be meeting next week to get organized to assure the replacement of all the activities once completed by Bonnie Curtis.

Scholarships: No current report.

Other Business: Interbranch: Janet reported the recent meeting went very well; she is checking on possible locations for the branch meeting in October. She said that IBC won't be collecting dues from the branches this year.

Sunshine. No recent illnesses, but Carol Churkin and Cathy Medley are recovering. Sympathy was expressed to Joan Young on the recent loss of her husband.

Opportunity Drawings: Priscilla Kerr said all is going well, and she has items for the meeting on Saturday. She will, however need to leave prior to the drawing and asked for help with that, which was volunteered.

New Business: Goals for 2017-18: Membership, Visibility, Advocacy (new) and Collaboration with other organizations. Sandy Davini was thanked for hosting the meeting.

Meeting adjourned at 3:15.
