It will not happen.

What did happen is a long life of love and fun with her 4 grown children Roseann, David and Gloryanne, Danny and Nan. They lost Gail several years ago to Cancer. David and Gloryanne have a son and daughter, Danny and Nan have two sons. When they were little, those grandchildren helped Grandma make cookies in her spacious kitchen. Jean's sister Mary from outside Seattle, her brother Alan from Walnut Creek, and her beloved husband Dan will miss their family anchor, for so many activities centered around Jean's caring nature.

Dan and Jean traveled frequently, went on many cruises with Holland America and other ships; they went to Elderhostels in the Southwest with Dolores and Ed Hobbs, Dick and me. We six traveled to the coast, renting a house for several days. Jean loved our summer cabin, sleeping outdoors under the trees and starry skies. She and Dan bought a cabin on the Marysville-Laporte Road where for many years they entertained family and friends. AAUW Executive Council Meeting - December 13, 2018

Those in attendance were Joann Nixon, Carol Clark, Sandy Davini, Barbara Solheim, Janet Theiss, Karen Tuttle, Jeanine Rounds, and,Lee Jones was absent. Members at Large attending were Priscilla Kerr, Liz Skelly, Joan Young.

<u>Minutes</u> of November 8th meeting were approved with a typo correction.

Council Leader Report: Joann Nixon- began with the written report from Artis Buerki on the Nominating Committee, with a final report expected in January. Joann commented on how well everything went at the Coalition Brunch. Priscilla Kerr reported that we had made \$492 on our drawing at the Brunch and thanks all who helped, including the donation of the Lindbergh basket. This drawing will be the only one we offer at our meetings this year. There was discussion about the possibility of limiting our offerings to baskets that feature food and wine.

Joann showed the new "thank you" <u>note cards</u> with our logo that she had printed. She talked about the <u>Tech Trek Alumni event</u> scheduled for January 16. One suggestion is that we invite current and Alumni TT girls to help with the Garden Tour. Barbara Solheim moved and Carol Clark seconded that we provide a Garden Tour ticket to each girl who helps at the event. Motion Passed.

Joann said she will be away in January during Executive Committee meeting, and Janet offered to prepare the agenda and run the meeting.

<u>Correspondence</u>: Sandy Davini passed around some recent information.

Treasurer's Report: Sandy Davini,- reviewed the report she had emailed. Said we are doing well. We have received this year's \$450 from Yuba County Superintendent of School and \$900 from Sutter County toward our Tech Trek program costs. Joann requested we augment the Tech Trek budget by \$100 for activities related to Alumni activities (line 55 in budget). Janet moved and Sandy seconded the motion, Motion passed.

There was considerable discussion about a need for a computer and projector for our branch. We would have to have someone knowledgeable about the appropriate one,

someone to bring it to meetings, and someone who knows how to operate it. Both Liz Skelly and Janet Theiss indicated they can obtain good information about what we should get and what the costs might be. A team effort will be needed; it was agreed we should return to the discussion when we get more information.

Public Policy: Martha Bunce, chair was not present

Membership: Lee Jones, chair was not present, but Sandy indicated that our current membership number is 84.

Other reports from Executive Council

Bylaws Update: Karen Tuttle - no business this month.

<u>Communications.</u> Janet Theiss - <u>Feather Vane</u>: a reminder that Artis would like any information by 12/17. <u>Phoners:</u> Joan Young indicated that the meeting callers are doing a good job.

<u>Programs</u>: Barbara Solheim - The <u>November meeting</u>, held at the Refuge, went well. Our <u>January 19th meeting</u> will be at the Museum. Jeanine said she contacted Salim about the menu, and the main dish will be lasagna.

Projects: Carol Clark - STEM— Things are going well. There will not be a December meeting. Martha is continuing to get speakers. Our keynote speaker is Preet Didbal. The Conference is scheduled for April 2 due to the late holiday return of YCUSD. Garden Tour- Date will be May 4. Janet will have Garden Tour tickets for Joann to provide to the mothers of Tech Trek girls who agree to serve as young hostesses. Tech Trek: Carol said there is information needed by State, and she is working on that. She will attend a coordinating meeting in Sacramento on January 6, and Dr. Karen Chiechi has sent the preliminary information to the teachers. The recommendations are due from the teachers by February 8, and the following week we will need to meet and select the students by February 11. All branches will be allowed to send no more than 6 students. Because Carol must start her work at the schools on February 1, a great deal of support is needed. UC Davis is also looking for a mature young lady to serve as Junior Counselor for the week at Davis; this person must have attended the Tech Trek summer program and be at least a junior or senior in high school. Carol will be holding a planning meeting for Tech Trek the week after the January 6th Branch Coordinators' Meeting, and hopes that anyone volunteering to help us out will be able to join us.

Scholarship: Jeanine Rounds reported she had been contacted by the college to indicate that some changes in

procedure are being made, and they will be getting back to her.

Other Business: Interbranch: Janet Theiss, IBC Rep. said the meeting will be in Chico on February 2. She will write an article about the event for the upcoming <u>Feather Vane</u>. Concern was expressed about AAUW members who were seriously impacted in the disastrous fire in Paradise. **Historian:** No report. **Sunshine:** Gretchen Cupp was not present, but the group was saddened to hear about the unexpected passing of Jean Jacuzzi, and Gretchen is aware of this. Meeting adjourned at 2:50. The next meeting is January 10, 2019
