OUR BRANCH HISTORY THEN & NOW

Our branch of AAUW was founded in 1955, more than 57 years ago. The 50s and 60s were a growth period for the American Association of University Women. By 1957 there were more than 140,000 members nationwide.

Four of the charter members who started the Marysville-Yuba City Branch of AAUW in 1955 are still members of our branch. They are **Alice Dewey, Dorothy Jang,** and **Beverly Balfour** who remain in the area as active members of the Branch, and **Mary Margaret Purviance,** who has moved to Hays, Kansas, but maintains her membership in this branch. Over the next few months in Feather Vane I will tell you about these four talented ladies.

This month let me tell you about **Alice Dewey** who was one of the 15 founding members of our branch. Her daughter, Janet Theiss, an AAUW member initially because of her mother, tells us that supporting women's rights to use their strengths and skills has always been a part of her mother's life. Alice came from an educated family. Alice's mother, a Latin and Greek scholar, belonged to a women's college-graduate group in Berkeley. Alice's father was a mining engineer. Both were Cal graduates so Alice had her family's encouragement and support when she chose mathematics, a very unusual major for women in the 1930s. She graduated from UC Berkeley in 1939 and taught for several years in Fort Jones. Her next job was teaching mathematics at

Yuba City High School. Alice met her future husband, Martin, and settled in this area. Her third child was an infant when she joined the in-the-process-of-organization Marysville-Yuba City AAUW group. She was 38 years old when she joined AAUW and has maintained her membership in the Branch ever since. Alice was very humble during the 1990s when her fellow AAUW members called her forward to praise her for her dedicated insight and extra help which inspired a former YCHS student to first give hundreds of computers to local schools in her honor, and then to continue to give very generously twice every year to scholarships at both Yuba College and Sierra College.

AAUW NEWS

November 6, 2012 was an historic election day for women. According to the National Women's Law Center (www.nwlc.org), women broke new barriers in 2012 – and we should be proud:

- A record number of women ran for Congress in 2012, and while still far from equal, the number of women in the next Congress will be historically high –18% (up from 16+%). Both the House and the Senate will have more women than the previous congress.
- New Hampshire elected the nation's first all-female delegation to Congress, as well as a new female governor.
- We still have a long way to go. Four states have still NEVER sent a woman to Congress – Delaware, Vermont, Iowa and Mississippi. And of course we still wait for a female president.

AAUW's *It's My Vote: I Will Be Heard* campaign was part of the effort to get out the women's vote. Fifty-three percent of the electorate nationwide was female. AAUW's newest research report *Graduating to a Pay Gap* reveals that one year out of college women face a pay gap that affects not only their life-long earning power, but also their ability to pay off student debt. Women still earn only 77 cents for each dollar earned by men. Equal Pay for Equal Work is a long held goal of AAUW. Copies of the report and of Lilly Ledbetter's book, *Grace and Grit: My Fight* for Equal Pay and Fairness at Goodyear and

<u>Beyond</u>, are available on the AAUW website (<u>www.aauw.org</u>). Another Christmas present idea!

Do you know a woman graduate student who could use a little help with education expenses. Remember that AAUW provides grants and fellowships. Deadlines are approaching.
