Our speaker on November 16 will be Nicole Rubio, Volunteer Recruitment and Engagement Coordinator for Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Placer and Yuba Counties. Nicole was part of the LEAD Yuba-Sutter class of 2022 where she learned that CASA wanted to open an office in Yuba County. Her connections as both a realtor and Chamber of Commerce Ambassador made her the right candidate to get a CASA office started in Marysville. CASA trains volunteers to become court appointed special advocates to help at-risk foster youth navigate the court system and provide support and stability for children who have been placed in foster care due to abuse or neglect. The SBRLT is an accredited land trust that protects parcels from development by purchasing conservation easements, which help both farmers and wildlife. Their work covers Yuba, Sutter, and Colusa counties. We also learned about the Middle Mountain Interpretive Hikes, their sister organization in charge of hikes in the Buttes. Lilly Ledbetter, whose fight for equal pay changed U.S. laws, dies at 86 –

Lilly Ledbetter passed away on October 12 in Alabama. She is shown here in 2014 speaking at the White House on Equal Pay Day. She was a woman who could not join AAUW, who did not benefit from her extreme efforts, and whom AAUW championed. She made a difference in achieving equal pay for equal work. 
