Get ready to advance legislation that makes a difference! This spring the AAUW California 2025 Lobby Days event will be held over two days with an **in-person meeting day at the State Capitol on Tuesday, April 8 and a virtual meeting day**

over Zoom on Wednesday, April 9, 2025. We encourage all AAUW California members to participate in this opportunity for advocacy that is essential to achieve our legislative priorities!

Starting in January, the Public Policy Committee will evaluate new bills introduced in the state legislature which are aligned with our <u>Public</u> <u>Policy Priorities</u>. In mid-March, the committee will meet to select 30-35 bills to make up AAUW California's 2025 Legislative Agenda, including the top three bills that we will advance during Lobby Days. Training materials on these three bills will be posted on the state website by March 26, 2025, and a **mandatory training webinar will be held on March 31, 2025 at 7:00pm.**

The meeting was called to order at 1:05p.m.

There were no additions or corrections to the minutes.

Martha re-introduced a discussion from last month regarding the AAUW Fund and how to insure that our membership understands its purpose. In addition, more information needs to be disseminated regarding the local "Virtual Tea Party" fundraiser. At the January Affiliate Meeting, Martha will explain that the money our members donate is sent to the Education arm of the Fund. Artis will review the letter that is sent with the tea bag request to donate to determine if clarification is needed. Additionally, Linda will add a page to the 25-26 Yearbook explaining the fund.

Leader's Report

Martha reiterated the need for the ERA to be published by the congressional Archivist. All members should write to their senators and representatives.

Lobby Day: California AAUW has not yet decided the issues for which we will lobby. The date is April 8th and members are encouraged to sign up. All the information needed to discuss issues with our state representatives is provided.

Correspondence

North State Public Radio and the Sutter County Sheriff have solicited donations. The latter would be for the National Children's Safety council. The Food Bank sent a thank you for our contribution. It was most likely requested by a speaker at our affiliate monthly meeting.

Treasurer's Report

EC members received the updated budget spreadsheet through email. Sandy reported that \$658 was received through the tickets purchased at the Coalition Brunch on December 9th. Feather Vane JAN. 2025 Coalition Brunch Report

Artis was our representative on the brunch planning committee. She was happy to report that there were new groups attending the brunch. A reservation made with Hillcrest is a guarantee to pay, therefore, it creates a burden on the budget when there are no shows. Gwyn will remind members of that when she sends out the January invitation.

The January 17th meeting speaker will be Dave Rubiales.

The Red Cross would like to speak to the membership and were disappointed to learn that no spots are available until October.

<u>STEM</u>

The next EC meeting is January 9th.


