Program Notes by Gwyn Baker, Program Chair



Join us on **April 12th** when Dr. Jasbir S Kang will deliver a presentation titled, *Sikh Migration to the Sacramento Valley*, covering both the basics of the Sikh religion and their pre-migration history. Dr. Kang was born in Punjab, India and moved to the US in 1986. He served as Medical Director of the Hospitalist

Program, Adventist Health+Rideout for the past 15 years, and remains a full-time hospitalist at the Medical Center. As a practicing physician and community activist based in Yuba City, he has served on the boards of various nonprofits. He co-founded

the Punjabi American Heritage Society in 1991 and the Punjabi American Festival in 1995 to foster crosscultural understanding. He also helped create the Sutter County Museum exhibit documenting the history of Punjabi Americans and coordinating the publishing of a book on the Punjabi pioneers of California.


