MEMBERSHIP: Shape the Future in January and February - Opportunity for New Members by Linda Zall and Sandy Davini

Do you have a friend who would like to join our branch? Shape the Future is an exciting opportunity for potential members to save some money by joining our branch between January 17, 2026, and February 21, 2026.

In January and February, please invite prospective members to come to branch meetings with you to see what AAUW is about. Membership is open to both women and men who have at

least an associate degree or greater. If a new member joins at our January or February branch meeting, they will save \$37 on their AAUW National portion of dues for the first year. That means they can join for a full twelve months for just \$78 (instead of \$115). New members would owe a full year's dues when they renew their membership a year later.

Lobby Day – The 2026 Lobby Day will have a new perspective as far as timing. It begins March 27 and ends on April 17, and our AAUW members will be in touch with CA State politicians in person and by Zoom in the district where they live.

Lobby Days: Important Dates

- **January 16, 2026:** Last day to fill out this survey to participate.
- **March 23, 2026:** Mandatory webinar training session for participants, 7-8pm PT via Zoom. Training materials will be posted to the AAUW California website a week prior to the webinar.
- **March 27-April 17, 2026:** In-person in-district meetings, as scheduled by your Team Leader.
- **April 8-10, 2026:** Virtual meetings via Zoom, as scheduled by the Public Policy Committee

This year we're introducing a new approach to Lobby Days that prioritizes in-district meetings. As we transition to this model, we will also keep a zoom meeting option for members who are unable to travel to in-district meetings. This shift was inspired, in part, by our recent trials and tribulations with Lobby Days meetings in Sacramento. Over the past two years, it has become increasingly difficult to secure meetings with legislative offices in the Capitol as they are routinely overbooked with meetings tending to be confirmed at the last minute, short (most last no more than 15 minutes), and held with staffers rather than legislators (84 of 94 in 2025).

This shift to in-district meetings for Lobby Days was also inspired, in part, by the experiences of the Redlands Branch, who took a different approach and saw remarkable results. By scheduling Lobby Days in-district, they were able to secure eight in-person

meetings. These meetings were confirmed well in advance, were longer, and offered a much better chance of speaking directly with legislators. We highlighted their success in our November Public Policy survey, and members overwhelmingly indicated a preference for meeting with district offices.

The meeting was called to order at
1:25p.m.

There was a correction to the December
meeting regarding the date of this month's
Branch Meeting. It is January 17th.

Tech Trek - Neither Martha nor Doreen
have been successful in reaching the
Yuba County Schools superintendent to
elicit his support of the program.
Tech Trek committee members are
currently contacting area schools to
encourage science teachers to nominate
7th grade girls to attend the camp.
Applications for Tech Trek are due
January 31st.

Correspondence -There were two thank
you notes. One from last month's
speakers, Phyllis and Victoria for the
honorary to the Friends for the
Preservation of Yuba County History.

The second was from Tawny Dotson, Yuba College President for the ongoing partnership between the college and AAUW.

Coalition Brunch - Artis reported that there were nearly 100 guests, over 40 from AAUW, at the annual gathering in December. Eight organizations attended. Newly involved are the Red Cross, Blue Star Moms, Tri-Counties Respite Care, and the Valley Quilt Guild.

Hillcrest is reserved for next year, the 2nd Saturday in December. AAUW cleared approximately \$1026.

Public Policy -This year Lobby Day will focus on District Offices and will likely be held the week that the legislators are on Spring recess from Sacramento, which is March 26th to April 6th. The deadline for indicating interest to AAUW CA is January 16th, however, that is likely flexible.

Public Policy news comes out once a month. If you are interested and do not receive it, contact Martha Bunce and she will forward it to you.

Membership - “Shape the Future” is operative during January and February, allowing new members to pay half the normal National dues. If a person has been a previous member, there must be a two-year gap in their membership to receive the discount.

This is a great time to invite interested people to the Branch Meeting in order for them to enjoy the fee break.

There are currently two Allies, members who have not completed a degree. Linda

will develop a handout at the meeting, explaining how to become an ally.

Garden Tour -The flyer is on our website. Facebook page will be advertising it and thanking the sponsors.

The committee is looking for local “influencers” who will help get the word out.

Tickets are being prepared for approximately 10 local service groups to raffle at their gatherings to further help with turnout.

All but one of the gardens is in Marysville. The Yuba City garden is close to the ticket sale site. It is the 175th anniversary of Marysville and there is a concerted effort to partner with the celebration.

New members who were garden owners last year are helping on the committee. All the artists have been contacted.

A new plan is to solicit restaurants to be sponsors. In return, they will be noted in the Garden Tour brochure and hopefully attendees will decide to have lunch at one of the 10 solicited for sponsorship.

Programs -There are currently 36 reservations for the January 17th Branch Meeting.

Chuck Smith, Editor of the Appeal Democrat, is the speaker.

The February program will feature AAUW Marysville-Yuba City member Gretchen Culp and her husband, Steve Greenstein,
